





FACTS ABOUT: MORU

The Moru area in the Serengeti National Park, Tanzania, is a unique and historically rich region known for its diverse wildlife and cultural significance. Here are some key facts about the area:

· Location & Landscape

Moru Kopjes is located in the central-southern Serengeti.

It is famous for its granite rock formations (kopjes), which provide shelter for wildlife and stunning views of the plains. The area consists of open grasslands, acacia woodlands, and seasonal water sources.

Wildlife

Moru is one of the best places in the Serengeti to see black rhinos, as it is home to a rhino conservation project.

It is a key migration route for the Great Wildebeest Migration during certain times of the year.

• Rhino Conservation

Moru is one of the few places in the Serengeti where black rhinos can be spotted.

A protected rhino zone has been established to monitor and safeguard the rhino population from poaching.



Thus to honor their return, we felt privileged to name it after these mighty beings. 

Where to Spot Endemic Birds in Ruaha

Ruaha is home to several endemic and near-endemic birds, best seen in these key areas:

- 1. Ruaha River & Riverine Forests
 - Yellow-collared Lovebirds and Tanzania Red-billed Hornbills
 - Found near riverbanks and woodlands
- 2. Miombo Woodlands & Dry Savannah
 - · Ashy Starlings and Southern Ground Hornbills
 - Common in open woodlands and around termite mounds
- 3. Rocky Hills & Outcrops
- Ruaha Chat a true Ruaha special
- Look for them on rocks in hilly, dry areas like Mbagi and Ifuguru Hills
- 4. Baobab Zones
- Lovebirds and Starlings nest in baobab hollows
- · Found around central Ruaha and Msembe area

Birdwatching Seasons

The best birding in Ruaha occurs during the wet season (November to April), when migratory birds from Europe and northern Africa arrive, and resident species are in breeding plumage. The dry season (May to October) is excellent for spotting raptors and waterbirds around shrinking water sources.


Ruaha National Park

THE BIG



The Serengeti National Park is one of the best places in the world to see the Big Five game animals. The term "Big Five" originally referred to the five most difficult animals to hunt on foot in Africa - the lion, leopard, elephant, rhinoceros, and Cape buffalo. Today, the term is used more broadly to refer to these iconic animals that are a major draw for safari-goers.

CONSERVATION IN TANZANIA

Asanja plays a vital role in black rhino conservation in Tanzania, supporting efforts to protect one of the world's most endangered species.

In 1993, only three black rhinos remained in the Moru Kopjes area of the Serengeti. By 2013, estimates showed just 133 rhinos left in Tanzania. To combat this, TANAPA and the Frankfurt Zoological Society established the first rhino conservation project in Moru, building the Michael Grzimek Memorial Rhino Post for monitoring and protection. In 2019, nine rhinos were reintroduced to boost the wild population.

Asanja, being part of the Moru Kopjes ecosystem, works closely with TANAPA on conservation initiatives. This includes earmarking 43 rhinos for easy identification and supporting a dedicated Rhino Capture Unit equipped for safe tagging and relocation.

To enhance monitoring, Asanja collaborated with TANAPA to introduce LoRaWAN technology, where sensors implanted in rhino horns send signals to a control center for remote tracking. Rangers received specialized training in rhino and tactical man-tracking.

Poaching remains a major threat, with intelligence units working outside the park to prevent illegal activities. Bushmeat hunting with cable snares also endangers rhinos. Asanja supports TANAPA's initiative to remove snares, contributing to the removal of 20,000 snares in the past year alone.

Through these efforts, Asanja remains committed to preserving Tanzania's black rhino population for future generations



OUR ROLE IN THE COMMUNITY

Asanja's role in helping the community in Tanzania has taken many forms, from supporting local businesses and organizations to providing education resources.
